Richmond to seek U.S. House seat

He says Cao failing to support Obama

State Rep. Cedric Richmond of New Orleans announced Tuesday that he will run again for the 2nd Congressional District seat in 2010, after narrowly missing the Democratic runoff in 2008.

The 35-year-old Democrat wasted little time aligning himself with President Barack Obama -- a popular figure in the overwhelmingly Democratic district -- while noting Republican incumbent Anh "Joseph" Cao's votes in opposition to some of the White House agenda.

"The metropolitan area deserves a representative who will work with President Obama to bring economic recovery to Louisiana, promote better and more affordable health care and keep assault weapons off our streets," Richmond said, adding that Cao has sided with GOP leadership on critical votes such as the economic stimulus.

A native of eastern New Orleans, Richmond represents the 101st House District in the Louisiana Legislature, where he is chairman of the House Judiciary Committee. He also serves on the Ways and Means Committee. Richmond graduated from Benjamin Franklin High School, before earning a bachelor's degree from Morehouse College in Atlanta and his law degree from Tulane University.

It has come to our attention that a much anticipated new city-wide program, the Neighborhood Assistance Program (NAP), which was developed by the Office of Recovery Disaster Administration (ORDA), has been cut from the city budget.

The NAP was a program that was to provide direct grants and matching grant money to neighborhoods and communities across the city. Many local organizations were not only informed about the NAP, but were eagerly awaiting the opening of the grant-making process.

The program was to have started this fall, and would have had grants of up to \$10,000 available for local organizations. It is greatly dismaying to see the dismantling of a program that truly embraced the power and effectiveness of citizen groups and recognized their vital roles in rebuilding our city.

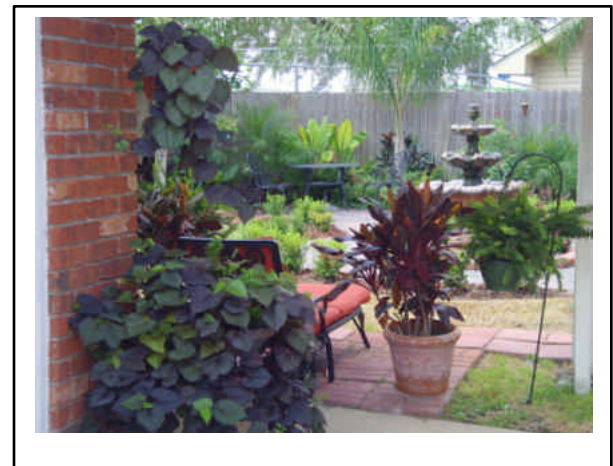

Meeting addresses blight, code violators

N.O. neighborhoods pinpoint the worst

Adrienne Quintal stood at the busy floor microphone and asked the city's Code Enforcement Department for help.

Representing the Spring Lake subdivision in eastern New Orleans, Quintal was one of about 120 neighborhood leaders who met for six hours Saturday with city officials hoping to recruit residents to join the fight against rampant blight.

Quintal cut straight to the long-standing complaint of many of the community leaders: the city's slow-moving code-enforcement system.

As preparation for Saturday's session at City Park's Pavilion of the Two Sisters, each of the 80 New Orleans neighborhoods that registered was asked to submit a list of its Top 10 blighted properties, giving the department a Top 800 list of properties that it needs to address.

LHFA Public Meeting to be held at 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, September 23, 2009

The Louisiana Housing Finance Agency will hold a public meeting to receive comments on a proposed amendment to the State's 2007/08 GO Zone Qualified Allocation Plan. The proposed amendment will permit Taxpayers with a 2009 or 2010 allocation of returned GO Zone Credits that are concerned about a possible adverse Treasury ruling requiring all buildings with GO Zone Credits to be placed in service by December 31, 2010 to be reprocessed with a reduced number of buildings. The Agency would like all Taxpayer/Developers who have not closed or who have not commenced construction to present to the Agency their concerns about completing their projects in light of the possible adverse Treasury ruling.

Following the discussion concerning Projects with GO Zone Credits, the Agency is proposing to discuss the following additional matters:

1. The Treasury Department's 1602 Exchange Program for Projects with 2007 and 2008 Per Capita Credits and the possible expansion of the 1602 Exchange Program to returned GO Zone Credits;
2. The status of projects that are currently in need of additional funds.
3. The status of projects that are not in compliance with their project schedules and projected Place-In- Service Dates.

The Agency strongly recommends that developers attend this meeting prepared to disclose and discuss all issues surrounding developments currently funded with 2007/2008 credits so that a comprehensive

strategy may be fully vetted and presented at the October Board of Commissioners meeting.

N.O. considers mall revival in struggling area

Council takes on revival of N.O. mall

On Thursday, the New Orleans City Council is expected to consider a proposal to use future tax revenue to help transform the site of the defunct Lake Forest Plaza mall into a modern shopping center called the New Orleans East Marketplace.

At least four of the seven council members have endorsed the proposal in principle, but the president of a government watchdog organization says the deal amounts to little more than a public bailout for the developers.

The property's owners, Regional Transit Authority Chairman Cesar Burgos and First NBC Bank Chief Executive Ashton Ryan, say their project will bring people back to eastern New Orleans by providing jobs and essential services.

Katrina suits cost levee districts

U.S. judge gives nod to \$20 million deal

U.S. District Judge Stanwood Duval has approved a \$20 million settlement involving federal class-action lawsuits that claimed sloppy work by the Orleans, Lake Borgne Basin and East Jefferson levee districts contributed to levee breaches during Hurricanes Katrina and Rita.

The settlement money actually would come from insurance proceeds resulting from policies the levee districts held on the levees, said Joseph Bruno, an attorney representing plaintiffs in the case.

But a decision on how the money would be distributed is a long way off, Bruno said.

"We expect an appeal," he said. "No decision on the distribution of this settlement will be made until the appellate process is completed. That could take months if not years."

The money will be held in a fund for the benefit of the estimated 500,000 people and businesses who lived in or owned property in East Bank communities in Jefferson, Orleans and St. Bernard parishes that are included in the class settlement.

Duval will appoint a "special master" to recommend how the fund should be used to benefit the settlement class "and whether the distribution should be made for the benefit of the class as a whole or to individual class members," his order said.
