### **Six Flags group needs more time to get cash**

Officials of a Louisiana company partnering with the Nickelodeon TV network to re-develop the abandoned Six Flags amusement park in eastern New Orleans asked the State Bond Commission to withdraw its request for \$100 million in Hurricane Katrina business development bonds after they failed to post \$500,000 with the state treasury by Monday's deadline.

However, Dan Kyle, the new chief financial officer of Southern Star, said that the developers will return to the November commission meeting and will have the money needed.

The project is expected to create about 1,650 temporary construction jobs and about 735 permanent jobs. The average payroll would be about \$30 million. ## Project 3/50

This week I came across some interesting information about Project 3/50. The purpose of the project is to encourage consumers to pick 3 *local* businesses and commit to spending \$50 (total) each month on these businesses. It may require you to change your shopping habits, but in the long run we all will benefit.

The 3/50 Project was created to build revenue for independent brick and mortars, and doesn't include home-based businesses or franchises. The reasoning behind this is that "If just half the employed U.S. population spent \$50 each month in independently owned businesses, their purchases would generate more than \$42.6 billion in revenue."

Additionally, "**For every \$100 spent in independently owned stores, \$68 returns to the community through taxes, payroll, and other expenditures. If you spend that in a national chain, only \$43 stays here. Spend it online and *nothing comes home.***"

I encourage you to print some extra copies of the attached flyer about the project and distribute them to others to encourage them to support our local economy.

The timing of my learning about the project was especially remarkable because I read an article on the 3/50 Project on the evening of the same day that I had stopped by Jazz City Java coffee shop on my way to work and purchased iced coffee with caramel and whipped cream (yum!) for myself and some of my co-workers. I hoped that sharing the coffee would encourage those who received it (and had never visited the coffee shop before) to stop by sometime soon and purchase a beverage, pastry or sandwich themselves.

The 8-week academy for citizens mirrors programs run by some other law enforcement agencies...to open lines of communication between officers and citizens.

The weekly classes will start in mid-November, and are by invitation only.

## **Status of Methodist Hospital Purchase**

ENONAC Secretary Debbie Degruy-Gordon recently asked Mayor Ray Nagin for an update on the status of the purchase of Methodist and Lakeland Hospitals. The closing was to take place mid-October and nothing has been published or announced that this has taken place.

Mayor Nagin responded that the closing has been pushed back until December. The second set of appraisals that HUD requires came back lower than the purchase agreement. According to the Mayor, "We are not allowed by law to pay more than the appraised value." A HUD reviewer came in and is reviewing both appraisals to come up with an acceptable amount that meets HUD regulations.

Mayor Nagin said that he does not anticipate any more delay and the purchase should be complete in December.
