**NEW ORLEANS, LA** – Alicia Plummer, a businesswoman, civic leader and Vice President of the New Orleans East Business Association announced her candidacy for New Orleans City Council District E today.

Plummer is a real estate broker, realtor and owner of Plummer Realty Group. She has been a multi-million dollar real estate sales producer for the past 10 years. She serves as Director of Sales and Broker for Eastover Realty. She is a founding member of the East New Orleans Area Brokers and Realtors organization. She led the Fairway Estates Homeowners Association as president for seven years. She also serves as a Commissioner and Secretary of the Orleans

Parish Hospital Service District A, and is a Commissioner with the New Orleans Regional Business Park.

Plummer has placed economic development, fighting crime and improving healthcare in District E as the top planks of her platform. ## **Update on TIF and Wal-Mart**

In response to a reader's inquiry, Senator Ann Duplessis, D-New Orleans, state that she's not sure where people are getting information that Wal-Mart is not coming to New Orleans East. To the contrary, Senator Duplessis said that she has had several discussions with very top level people and they are committed.

She added that the TIF proposal is with the Department of Economic Development now, and that she has been in constant communication with the Secretary of the department regarding the TIF and that we should be okay. The process at the State is that the proposal will be evaluated thoroughly by the Department of Economic Development. Stephen Moret, Secretary of Louisiana Economic Development, will then make a recommendation to the State's Bond Commission for approval. Secretary Moret's area is currently in the process of this evaluation.

As it relates to the Wal-Mart, Senator Duplessis said that she has also been in constant communication with the developer, Cesar Burgos, as well as Wal-Mart and they are definitely committed to coming to the Plaza site.

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## **Road Home Mitigation Grants Available**

Grants for up to \$7,500 are available for hurricane straps, shutters, raising air conditioners or raising water heaters to homeowners who elected to keep their homes after Hurricane Katrina. These funds can be obtained whether or not you previously qualified for a Road Home grant.

If you purchased hurricane shutters prior to March 16, 2008 you may be eligible for a mitigation grant to reimburse your costs. If you purchased shutters after this date, you are currently ineligible, but staffers are working on having this date requirement removed.

There are also grants of up to \$100,000 available for raising your home.

You should call the Road Home program at 877.824.8312 and provide your application ID. After your information is verified, Road Home will request a FEMA clearance package, and a Voluntary Participation Agreement (VPA) package will be mailed to you.

You should complete this VPA package and mail it back as soon as possible. In the meantime, FEMA will determine whether or not you are in a historic or environmentally protected area.

If you already had work done, you will need to show proof of payment.

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## **Judge Rules against Army Corps of Engineers for Mississippi River-Gulf Outlet**

Federal Judge Stanwood Duval ruled that the Corps is directly responsible for flood damage caused by the MR-GO after Hurricane Katrina. The area affected by this ruling included St. Bernard Parish, and the Lower Ninth Ward. Eastern New Orleans was not included in the ruling.

Councilmember Cynthia Willard-Lewis, whose district represents portions of eastern New Orleans and the Ninth Ward, made this statement in the POLICAMP Political Newsletter: "I will be meeting with the City Attorney to further explore our options for the residents of Eastern New Orleans".

## **Businessman fined for dumping**

**He has won millions in contracts**

Charlie Hampton and two local companies he owns that have won millions of dollars in demolition and construction contracts with federal and local government agencies were sentenced Tuesday. They must pay criminal fines totaling \$40,000 and clean up an illegal dumping site in eastern New Orleans.

Hampton, 55, a Gretna resident, and his companies, Hamp's Enterprises LLC and Hamp's Construction LLC, pleaded guilty to a series of criminal environmental charges in New Orleans Criminal District Court and the 19th Judicial District Court in Baton Rouge.

Department of Environmental Quality investigators discovered trucks operated by Hampton and Hamp's Construction involved in illegal dumping in a wetland area known as Lot 64 along Almonaster Boulevard. As part of the plea agreement, Hamps Construction will pay to clean Lot 64.

"The Almonaster corridor in New Orleans East has been a historic dumping site since before DEQ even existed," said Harold Leggett, DEQ Secretary. "It will take continuing and vigilant efforts by DEQ, local and federal agencies to end illegal dumping and other illegal activities in this area."

In April 2009, DEQ agents also arrested Hampton for allegedly submitting documents to the agency that contained false certifications of asbestos inspections that did not occur. Hamp's Enterprises pleaded guilty in the Baton Rouge court to those charges.

Hampton and his companies have received a number of federal, state and local contracts.

In January 2008, Hamp's Construction was awarded a \$514,000 contract by the Recovery School District to tear down L.B. Landry High School in Algiers.

Hamp's Construction was part of a joint venture that won several contracts with the Army Corps of Engineers after Hurricane Katrina for construction involving pump stations and levees, including a \$5.8 million contract to build the Elmwood Canal bridge at Kawanee Avenue in Metairie.

Hamp's also won a \$592,400 contract for conducting pile load tests for a new floodwall at Bayou Segnette State Park near Westwego.

The company also is a contractor in construction of a nearly complete levee segment in eastern New Orleans, a spokeswoman for the corps said.

Spokeswoman Nancy Allen said that if Hampton or his companies submit bids on future work with the corps, they will be required to disclose the convictions. The bids would then be referred to the Army's Judge Advocate General's office to determine whether Hampton or the companies should be debarred, which would make them ineligible for contracts.

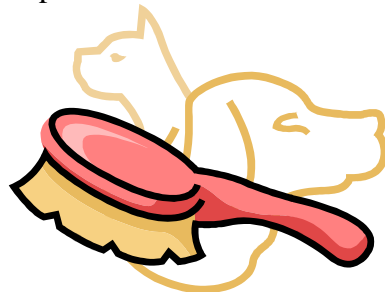

## **City Council Passes Resolution for Fast Forward Restart at its November 5 Meeting**

In support of the efforts of the Fast Forward Restart organization and the Fast Forward Main Street Demonstration Project, which aims to help revitalize New Orleans East and thirty of its small businesses, the City Council passed a resolution that proclaimed that Fast Forward Restart is working to assist small businesses in New Orleans East and has supported 220 small businesses in Louisiana since its formation in the wake of Hurricane Katrina in 2005. It also stated that the organization has launched the Fast Forward Main Street Demonstration Project to illustrate that focused support of small business entrepreneurs in a community results in a sustainable increase in revenue and jobs and creates a positive and supportive business environment for new entrepreneurs.

Additionally, the Fast Forward Main Street Demonstration Project has selected New Orleans East as one of its four demonstration sites, with each site consisting of thirty small businesses under major recessionary difficulty or facing extended disaster recovery. The Fast Forward Main Street Demonstration Project will provide to the small businesses in each site a two-year support and development program comprised of an online business assessment, a two-day refocusing and goal-setting workshop, and 24 months of follow-up coaching, as well as technical support and resource acquisition. The project seeks to create a sustainable micro network of thirty businesses that will offer each other mutual support, and will include other entities to promote community business support and entrepreneurial development.

The project goals include increasing the revenue of participating main street small businesses by 15%, increasing employment, and creating at least two new entrepreneurial small businesses in the community. The project will help to produce research on small business success factors, tax policy impacts on small businesses, health care costs to small businesses, environmental impact costs to small businesses, and the benefits of green opportunities.

The Board of Directors of Fast Forward Restart include New Orleans community leaders associated with organizations such as Common Good, the Lindy Boggs National Center for Community Literacy, Business Network International, and the United States Marine Corps Reserve. The Local Advisory Committee and supporters of Fast Forward Restart include community members associated with the New Orleans Regional Business Park, East New Orleans Neighborhood Advisory Commission, City Church, New Orleans East Business Association, Mary Queen of Vietnam, and United Way of Greater New Orleans.

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Scott M Darrah, Legislative Aide for Councilmember Cynthia Hedge Morrell, sent out the following notice:

“Pursuant to New Orleans City Code Section 2-1121, Paragraph 12, the Office of the Independent Police Monitor is required to hold at least one public outreach meeting in each council district of the city at least once every four months.

Councilmember Cynthia Hedge-Morrell has arranged for the first such meeting to take place December 8th, 2009 from 6 pm to 8 pm at the Gentilly Presbyterian Church, located at Franklin Avenue and Gentilly Blvd.”

## Beautification in the East

Many, many, many thanks to the Regional Planning Commission and the Department of Transportation and Development for the beautiful landscaping on Interstate 10 between Read Blvd. and Morrison Road!!!!

The project to plant trees in various areas around New Orleans was put out for bid last week. We are hopeful that an eastern New Orleans-based landscaper, such as R&P Landscaping, will win the bid.

This project will be conducted in two phases. Phase I will cover Hayne Blvd. to Chef Menteur Hwy. on Bullard Ave., Crowder Blvd., Dwyer, Wright Rd. and Joe Brown Park; and Read from Hayne to Almonaster. The planting will include Live Oaks, Nuttall Oaks, Fringe Trees, and Savannah Holly.

Phase II should begin next winter. Neighborhoods are encouraged to let the Department of Parks and Parkways know of other streets, green spaces, neutral grounds, parks, playgrounds that need trees. However, if playgrounds require other work, this may delay the planting of trees.
