Construction to start today on New Orleans East library

Ground will be broken today on a new library for eastern New Orleans, one of five new New Orleans libraries slated to be built at a total cost of more than \$27.5 million.

Construction will begin today to replace the New Orleans East Regional Branch library at 5641 Read Blvd., which was flooded by Hurricane Katrina.

The building is expected to be complete by late next year.

At 30,000 square feet, it will be the city's second-largest library, the largest being the Main Branch library. The new library will have

a focus on technology and innovation, according to a press release from the city.

"This location is special to the residents of East New Orleans for two major reasons," said Rica Trigs, chief operating officer for New Orleans public libraries. "It returns an essential service to their community and also will help to drive economic development and investment in this major corridor."

The four other libraries to be built are Robert E. Smith Library, 6301 Canal Blvd; Algiers Regional Library, 3014 Holiday Drive; Nora Navra Library, 1902 St. Bernard Ave.; and Norman Mayer Library, 2098 Foy St.

All libraries are scheduled for completion in the fall of 2010.

New Email Spam Threat

This information was distributed by the Chief Information Officer at the National Finance Center:

There is a massive spam campaign underway that poses as a message from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) asking people to register for H1N1 vaccinations.

The messages lead unwary users to a convincing-looking CDC site where they're asked to create a profile in order to receive a vaccination for the swine flu. The site urges users to download a vaccination profile archive, and includes a link to that download.

Clicking on the link, however, actually downloads and installs a new piece of malware (Trojan horse) that hijacks the Windows PC for nefarious activities, including sending more spam.

Do not open emails from people you don't know and don't click on embedded links unless you are very sure where they are going to take you.
