Filming to close Lakefront Airport overpass

Eastern New Orleans motorists can expect traffic delays for the next month and a half as film production activity closes the Lakefront Airport Overpass between Hayne Boulevard and the Sen. Ted Hickey Bridge, more commonly known as the "Seabrook Bridge."

The overpass closed to traffic starting May 18 and will continue through July 2, according to an advisory issued by the New Orleans Office of Film and Video.

Although studio officials are being tight-lipped about the production, it is believed to be "The Green Lantern".

The Coalition to Restore Coastal Louisiana and Entergy Corporation invite you to participate in a forested wetland restoration maintenance project at Audubon Louisiana Nature Center. Prior to Hurricane Katrina, Audubon Louisiana Nature Center was named one of the top five urban nature centers in the United States. The Nature Center suffered considerable damage from Hurricane Katrina which devastated its interpretive center, exhibits and an estimated 75 percent of the forest was destroyed.

This project is being completed through a partnership with Entergy Corporation, Restore America's Estuaries, Audubon Nature Institute, RPM Ecosystems, Natural Resource Conservation Service and the Coalition to Restore Coastal Louisiana. Councilmembers and the representatives discussed the current oil spill crisis and its potential effects on New Orleans, and specifically on Algiers.

District "E" Councilmember Jon D. Johnson said, "We recognize that this community was one of the first communities to return and rebuild after Hurricane Katrina. I want to join my colleagues in offering my support to the Vietnamese American community and commend their leadership for the work that they have done and will continue to do in our community."

ZONING DOCKET NO. 26/10 - CITY COUNCIL MOTION M-10-081

Requesting a Text Amendment to the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, No. 4,264 M.C.S., as amended, to amend Article 18 " Eastern New Orleans Renaissance Corridor Interim Zoning District" to allow an **exemption to the prohibition of LED signs** for schools and religious institutions, subject to proposed standards, on all lots within the Eastern New Orleans Renaissance Corridor Interim Zoning District in the Third Municipal District (Municipal Addresses: Multiple). The recommendation of the City Planning Commission being "FOR DENIAL".

CAL. NO. 27,958 - BY: COUNCILMEMBER HEDGE-MORRELL

An Ordinance calling an election for Saturday, October 2, 2010, at which shall be submitted to the electors of the City of New Orleans, a certain proposal to amend Article 3 of the Home Rule Charter of the City of New Orleans, by amending Section 3-105 paragraph (1) relative to **the election of council members**; to provide for the designation of Councilmember-at-Large, Division A and Councilmember-at-Large, Division B; and to **require a candidate** for the office of Councilmember-at-Large **to designate** the one division of the two Councilmember-at-Large divisions for which he is a candidate.
