### ENONAC Meeting Rescheduled

Sylvia Scineaux-Richard, ENONAC President, wants everyone to know that ENONAC's General Community Meeting will **not** be held this Tuesday (August 10, 2010). It is rescheduled for Tuesday, August 24, 2010 at the usual time of 6:00 pm at St. Maria Goretti Catholic Church.

This change was necessary to schedule the "Meet the Candidates" in the District 2 Senate Race before the early voting date per Commissioner Advisory Board (CAB) request and to allow the candidates to present their political platforms.

A flyer will follow with the details of "Meet the Candidates." The CAB meeting scheduled for the last Tuesday of the month (August 31, 2010 ) will be held as usual.

### Mayor Holds Budget Meetings in Districts D & E

Household of Faith Church on the I-10 Service Road was packed to capacity as District E resident came out to hear the city's plans for completing important projects in the area.

The Mayor stated that he came to New Orleans East first to acknowledge that we are a part of New Orleans. In the meeting, which was attended by District E Councilman Jon Johnson, his staff, and every city department head, a great deal of attention was given to rebuilding the hospital. Other issues were reducing blight and rebuilding the Joe W. Brown Memorial Park, public library and police stations.

The Mayor explained the concept of Budgeting for Outcomes, which requires that projects are matched to the amount of funding available in the budget. He stressed that we cannot get everything that we want, but we can provide input on the most important things that we need.

## Target Range may be Coming to Eastern New Orleans

Calvin Lopes gave us an update on the following item that will appear on the Tuesday, August 10th agenda for the City Planning Commission:

### CITY PLANNING COMMISSION MEETING AGENDA TUESDAY, AUGUST 10, 2010 1:30 P.M. CITY COUNCIL CHAMBER

**ZONING DOCKET 64/10** - Request by CITY COUNCIL MOTION M-10-252 for a Text Amendment to the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, No. 4,264 M.C.S., as amended, to amend Article 5, Section 5.9.3 C-2 General Commercial District Permitted Uses to **add indoor rifle and pistol ranges, when located on a site of at least two acres and on an Interstate Highway Service Road.**

Calvin points out that **we do not know the address** for this intended business and that Justin Schmidt, the attorney who spoke on behalf of the construction equipment zoning change said he knew nothing of this proposal and he did not know the specific location.

#### Some possible areas of concern:

- This only applies to specific locations, all in east New Orleans, therefore it is spot zoning
- It will likely be a 24 hour a day operation, encouraging thugs to hone their skills
- Noise can be contained but traffic, while not heavy, will be constant
- Loitering may be a problem
- There should be distance requirements (e.g. 1,000 feet) from any existing or future alcohol sales outlets, including hotels
- No consumption of alcohol anywhere on the premises
- Ammunition sales, firearms repairs, firearm rentals are very common for this type of operation
- Laws do not require any identification or specific record keeping for customers
- High-quality security cameras, inside and out, are an absolute necessity
